## Program Overview

- **Integrated project for the empowerment of adolescent girls and protecting them from the consequences of early marriage, early conception, sexual and domestic violence**– Empowers adolescent girls through Life Skills Education to negotiate with parents to continue education & delay age at marriage. Sexual Reproductive Health Services and Rights (SRHR) for married adolescent girls & spouses to delay first birth and reduce the burden of morbidity. Gender sensitization of young men to reduce sexual & domestic violence
- **Preventing Child Marriage & Early Pregnancy in India** – Empowers adolescent girls through Life Skills Education to delay age at marriage. Through SRHR delay first pregnancy and seek early treatment for reproductive morbidity.
- **Integrated Reproductive & Sexual Health and Family Planning Project For Adolescent Girls and Young Married Women in Urban Slums** – Universal coverage with SRHR services.
- **Integrated Project for Empowerment of Adolescent girls & Protecting Them from the Consequences of Early Marriage, Early Conception, Sexual and Domestic Violence** – Programme implemented in collaboration with Government of Maharashtra.
